Joyce took courses through Springfield Normal, and began teaching at country schools in the Platte Area. She continued courses each summer through Springfield and attended Calvin College in Grand Rapids, MI, eventually obtaining her Bachelor's degree. She was united in marriage to Allen Polly on December 29, 1954, in Platte. The couple was blessed with three children, Bob, Pegge and Linda. Joyce continued teaching, which



transitioned to teaching Kindergarten in Platte until her retirement in 1990. In her retirement years, she and

Allen would provide cleaning and maintenance for Harold Steele at his properties around Platte. They were 2009 recipients of the Pride in Platte Award. Following the passing of Allen in 2018, Joyce moved to Sioux Falls in 2020, to be closer to family.
